WHEN A GIRL EMBRACES THE CAMP LIFE, SHE MEETS NEW FRIENDS, TAKES ON ADVENTURE, AND MAKES MEMORIES FOR A LIFETIME.

As she sits around the campfire, paddles a canoe, shoots a bow and arrow, or climbs a natural rock wall for the first time, something in her begins to change. 

SLEEP-AWAY CAMP GENERAL INFORMATION

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Girl Scouts Nation's Capital strives to make camp available to all girls regardless of economic situation.

◆ **Sleep-Away Camp:** Financial aid is available for one sleep-away camp program per camper per summer. To apply for financial assistance, first secure your camper's space by registering for the program and session of choice and paying the \$50 registration deposit. After registration, please apply for financial assistance by completing our online application available at www.gscnc.org/sleepawaycamp. Please note, the online application will not be available until after registration opens January 14, 2020.

◆ **Summer Day and Evening Camp:** Financial aid is available for one day or evening camp per camper per summer. To apply for financial assistance, please go to gscnc.org/dayandeveningcamp to complete the online application and see full details for the financial aid process. All summer day and evening camp financial aid applications must be submitted at least 10 business days prior to the date you would like to apply for camp.

CAMP FACILITIES

We have glen shelters at all four camps. A glen shelter is a wooden structure with four screened sides, a wooden roof, and a wooden floor. Depending on their size, glen shelters will sleep four to six campers. Platform tents are located at Camp Coles Trip and Camp May Flather.

Platform tents have wooden floors with a large canvas tent secured over a wooden frame. Most platform tents sleep four to six campers. Facilities also include a dining hall, kitchen, camp office, health center, arts & crafts building, and a central shower house. Potomac Woods, Winona, and May Flather have swimming pools, while Coles Trip has river access.



BUS TRANSPORTATION

Hop on the bus for a ride to camp that's fun for girls and easy for parents!

For just **\$50 one-way or round trip**, parents can save time and gas, while girls enjoy singing songs, chatting and bonding with sister campers. We have two bus stops: Montgomery County, MD and Fairfax County, VA. The Maryland Bus stop serves Camp May Flather and Winona every full week of camp (Sun. – Fri.). The Virginia bus stop serves Camps Potomac Woods, May Flather, and Coles Trip every full week of camp (Sun. – Fri.) and will serve Camp Winona for 4 weeks this summer (June 21-26, July 12-17, July 26-31, and Aug 9-14).



CAMP STAFF

Camp staff are enthusiastic, talented, and caring individuals who are 18 years of age or older. We recruit both regionally and from around the world, and carefully select staff based on maturity, program skills, experience, and their ability to serve as role models. A health manager is in residence at the Health Center and all staff must attend an intensive pre-camp training session, including safety, activity planning, camper care, team building, and much more. Staff members who supervise high-adventure activities such as the pool, water sports, challenge course, archery, caving, and other areas receive additional training and certifications.

MEALS

Food service professionals prepare all our meals except for cookouts (campers prepare that!), and menus are planned with hungry, growing girls in mind. At camp, we provide kid-friendly food for all our campers, consisting of foods like chicken nuggets, macaroni and cheese, spaghetti, tacos, pizza, and more. All meals include fresh vegetables and fruits, and our food service staff can meet most special dietary needs.

HOW TO REGISTER FOR SUMMER CAMP PROGRAMS

Camp sessions fill up very quickly. We receive many phone calls and emails on opening days of registration. Please check your account information at least **one week prior** to the opening day using the checklist below to help make registration go more smoothly. For assistance at any point in this process, please contact our Customer Care team by email: registration@gscnc.org or phone: **202-237-1670**.

Visit gscnc.org and click eBiz (located in the top right corner of our home page). You'll need to make sure you know the following for registration:

◆ **Login Information:** (username and password). If you have previously registered your camper for summer camp or a Council event, your login is the same. Contact our Customer Care team if you have trouble accessing your account, or if your camper's Girl Scout membership is with a different council.

Once you login to your account, please check the following:

- ◆ **Contact Information:** Email any changes to your contact information to registration@gscnc.org.
- ◆ **Your camper's Guardian 1:** Only your camper's Guardian 1 will be able to register them for camp - not the troop leader, Guardian 2, or family manager. If you need to update this, please email registration@gscnc.org.

When registration opens, login and click Activities to find all our summer camp offerings.

- ◆ **Search for your desired camp:** Use the search box on the right side of the page to type in the camp program name.
- ◆ **Click the camp program name** in the listings in the center of the page. You may need to click the arrow button near the bottom of the page to go to the next page of listings.
- ◆ **Register for camp!** If you have any problems during the registration process, please contact registration@gscnc.org.

Remember, campers must register for the program units based on the grade they are currently in for the 2019-2020 school year.

CANCELLATIONS/REFUND

The \$50 registration deposit is non-refundable. The remainder of the camp fee (excluding the deposit) will be refunded if:

- ◆ The camper withdraws, and Girl Scouts Nation's Capital receives a written request at least five weeks prior to the start of the camper's session.
- ◆ The camper leaves camp due to an illness or injury, and Girl Scouts Nation's Capital receives a written request for a refund within two weeks of her return home. The refund will be prorated on a per diem basis.

If a camper leaves early due to behavior, missing home, or parent request, no refund will be provided.

If a program is cancelled and no alternate program is available, you will receive a full refund. Girl Scouts Nation's Capital reserves the right to cancel any program listed due to insufficient enrollment or other extenuating circumstances. Alternate programs or refunds will be offered.

NON-GIRL SCOUTS

Girl Scouts Nation's Capital summer camp programs are open to all girls completing grades K-12. See specific sleep-away and day and evening camps for grade or age restrictions per camp or programs.

Any girl who is not a current member is welcome to attend our programs, but they must register and become a Girl Scout Nation's Capital member. The registration fee is \$25. **You must register at least 24-hours before registering for camp.** To register as a member, please go to our website www.gscnc.org/join. DAY AND EVENING CAMP ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

CAMP PLACEMENT

Placement is not automatic for all camps. Some camps place campers based on a first come, first served basis while others use a lottery system. See the specific camp's description for more details. Most camps guarantee entry for campers of full-time volunteers – consider volunteering!

◆ **First Come First Served (FCFS) Camps:** Placement is automatic for FCFS camps. Once campers are registered online through eBiz, they have a space at camp. However, each camp is volunteer-run, and they need enough adults to help behind the scenes or to deliver programming. Most camps guarantee entry and offer priority placement for volunteers' campers.

◆ **Lottery Camps:** Placement is not automatic for lottery camps. When you pay in full, and complete your registration by the lottery registration deadline, you are buying a “ticket” into the camp lottery not a space in camp. Once the deadline passes, the camp leadership team will randomly select campers from the “tickets” to be accepted into camp and notify parents/guardians via email or mail. If your camper is not selected through the lottery, and you turn down the waitlist, a full refund will be issued. Each camp has different lottery registration and notification deadlines, please see the lottery camps Ashgrove Adventure, Burke Lake Adventures, Camp Crossroads, Camp Fairfax, Camp Summer Magic, and Camp Tuckerman descriptions for specific dates and details.

Hey, Girl Scout parents and guardians! Want to experience camp with your camper? All volunteers complete a background check through Girl Scouts Nation's Capital and receive pre-camp training. Volunteer roles include:

- *Unit Leader/Counselor*: Guide a group of campers through pre-planned activities with the help of another counselor or a teen aide.
- *Program/Center Volunteer*: Teach a skill or plan and lead a special activity like arts & crafts, nature/outdoors, STEM, high adventure, sports, etc.
- *Health Supervisor*: Provide first aid and manage camper and staff safety (requires First Aid/CPR certifications)



WHO CAN ATTEND DAY & EVENING CAMP?

Most of our day and evening camps are open to Girl Scouts completing grades K-12. Check individual camp descriptions on gscnc.org/dayandeveningcamp for specific grade requirements.

Girl Scout parents & guardians can attend camp too as volunteers and experience camp with their campers! There are so many jobs you can help do at camp, from leading a program or group, to bus chaperone and first aid. All volunteers are background checked and receive pre-camp training. 

REFUND AND CANCELLATION POLICY


