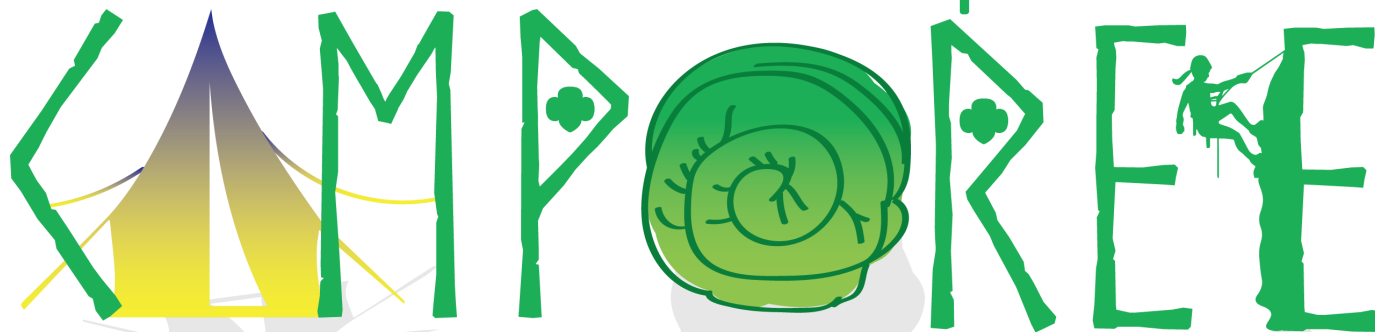

Camping Environment

- Large scale tent camping
- Camp latrines and portable bathrooms
- Draw water from central sources to use at your campsite
- Meals provided – no cooking at sites
- Programming includes: high adventure, outdoor skills and much more
- Parking at Camp Winona or other locations, campers and gear shuttled to camp

Ways to Attend

- Troops can attend with proper girl to adult ratio, plus one adult
- One adult must be a first aider and another must be Cookout/Campout trained
- Limited space available for girls not attending with a troop and parent/daughter pairs

Preparing for the Camporee

- Not sure about camping in tents or want to brush up on your outdoor skills?
- Attend a free **Outdoor Skills Day** offered in the spring at Council camps on Sunday afternoons - practice tent camping, learn outdoor skills, and get questions answered

Top Ten Ways to Get Ready

10. Secure Adult Volunteers:

You'll need an adult first aider and a Cookout/Campout certified adult who can attend the Camporee

9. Choose Transportation:

Find the best way to get your group and gear to the Camporee - transportation options available in early winter
