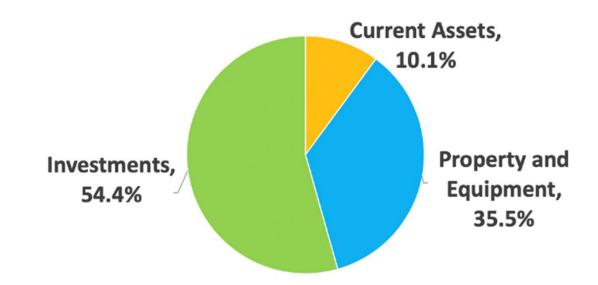

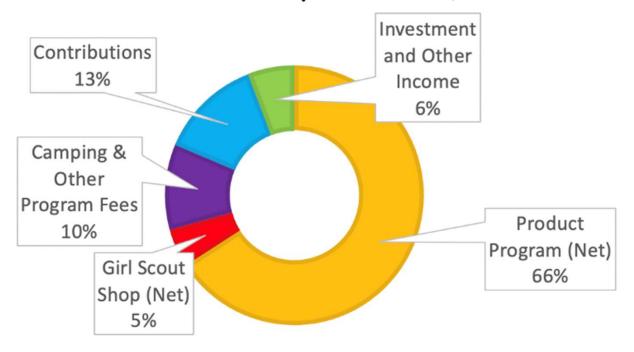

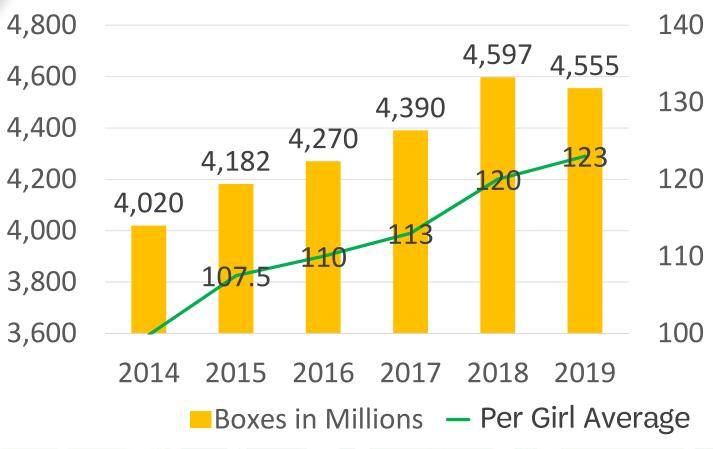

Forum Question

How can we better educate our parents and volunteers about the value of our entrepreneurship program?

How can we grow girl participation in the cookie program?





Program Delivery

- Emphasize program aspects and not logistics
- Highlight the five skills
- Encourage goal setting <u>before</u> program begins
- Hold Cookie College and Rallies earlier (Oct early Nov)



Older Girl Involvement

- Increase older girl opportunities, emphasize leadership and money management skills—resume builders
- Implement a teen troop mentorship program for younger troops
- Include older girls and inclusion in cookie promotion



Parent Education:

- Communicate to parents the skills girls' acquire by using:
 - ✓Online videos, PowerPoint presentations
 - ✓ Cookie Booth Camps
 - ✓ Mandatory meeting for parents to educate them
- Train new parents on how to support girls sell cookies and set financial goals.
- Show "How the Cookie Crumbles" and how troops use money earned in a handout.



Volunteer Training

- In Basic Leadership teach how cookies help girls gain financial literacy and business experience
- SU Cookie Manager or older Girl Scouts train troop committees on benefits and how to sell



Troop Proceeds and Rewards:

- Increase troop proceeds
- Revamp rewards:
 - √ appeal to older girls
 - √ appeal to younger girls
- Transition from rewards to experiences
 - ✓ Travel, Camp Credit, Scholarships, Internships



Technology

- Increase social media presence
- Offer additional electronic payment options
- Lower shipping costs



Other Suggestions

- Change cookie season
 - ✓ Later in the year- warmer weather avoid holidays
 - ✓ Or before the holidays and make season longer
- Healthier cookie options sugar free
