How to reserve a Program Kit?

Now that you have seen our exciting list of Program Kits, you're probably wondering how do you reserve? Below you will find step – by – step instructions on properly reserving and you will find a chart of where each kit is located on DoubleKnot.

Step 1: You will go to www.gscnc.org. On the homepage you will select members.

Step 2: You will look under For Girl Scouts and select the first subcategory Badges and Journeys.

Step 3: You will select Program Kits and then select Reserve.

Step 4: You will be taken to the reservation portal on DoubleKnot.

Step 5: Select the category (You will find a chart that shows the Program Kits category below). Then select the start date on the calendar (Ex: July 18th). Lastly, you will enter in how long you want to keep the kit for in the duration.

Step 6: You will select reserve next to the kit you wish to reserve. You will be prompted to Create New User Profile.

Step 7: Once your account has been created, the page will refresh with your cart on the right-hand side of the screen, and you will select check-out.

Step 8: You will enter in how many kits you are reserving, then hit continue. From there you will fill in the required information.
