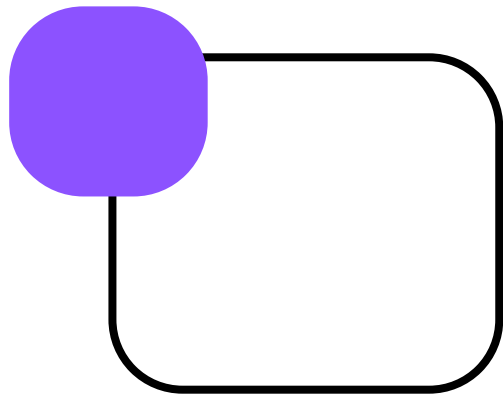
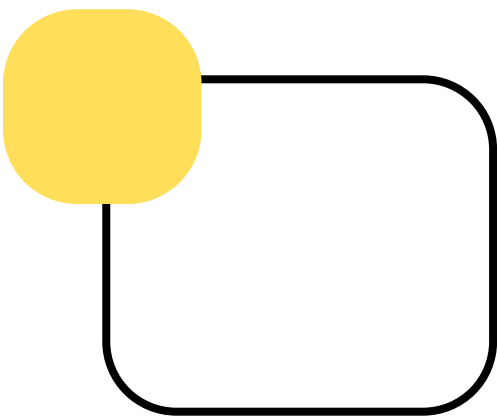
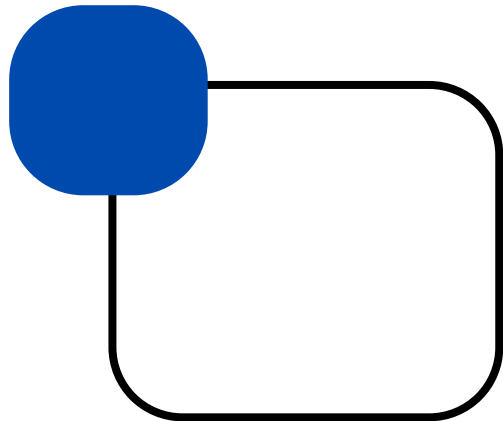
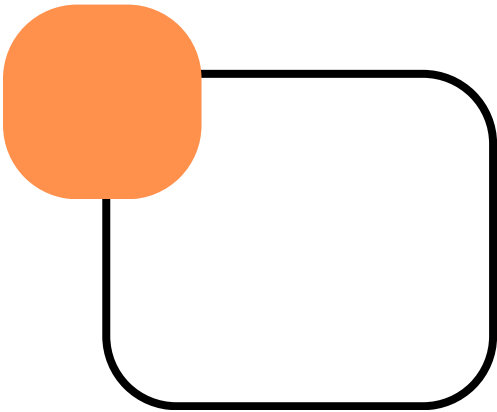
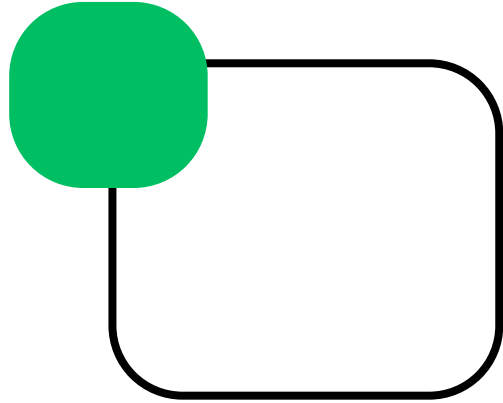
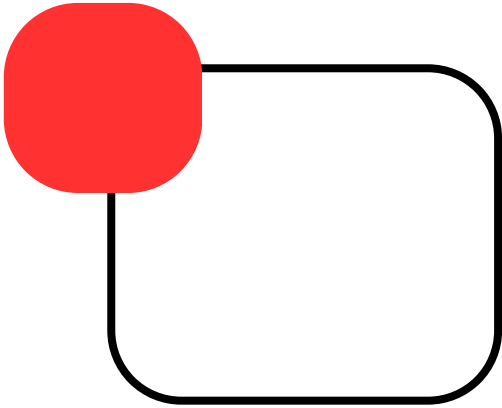
Sound Map

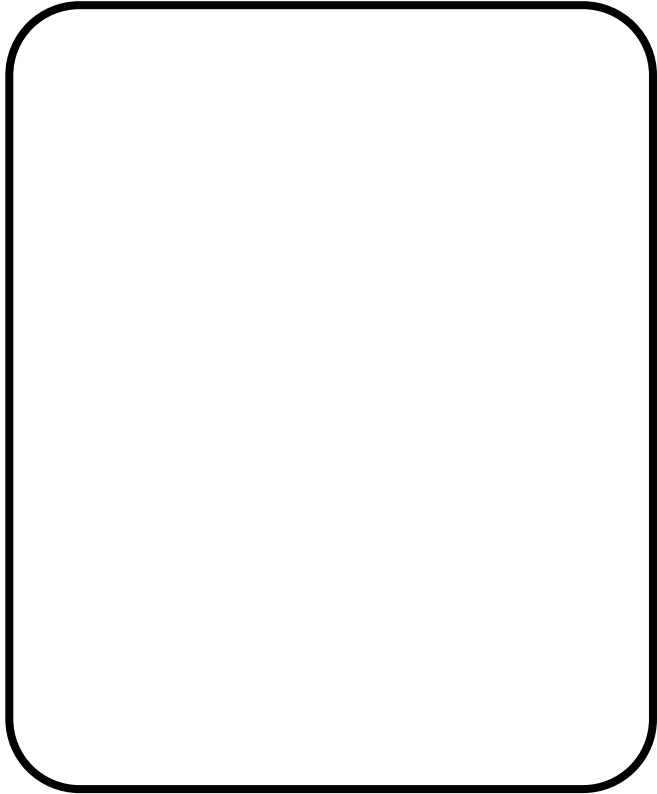
Rainbow Hike

Pick a hiking trail and see if you can find something in nature that matches each of these colors. If you are feeling inspired, you can draw a picture of the item you found which matches the color.

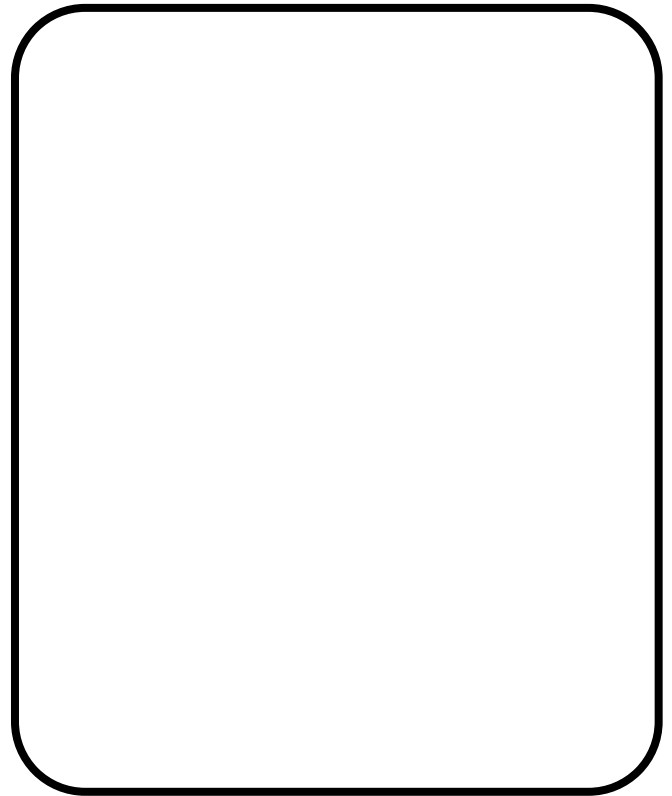


Close, closer, closest

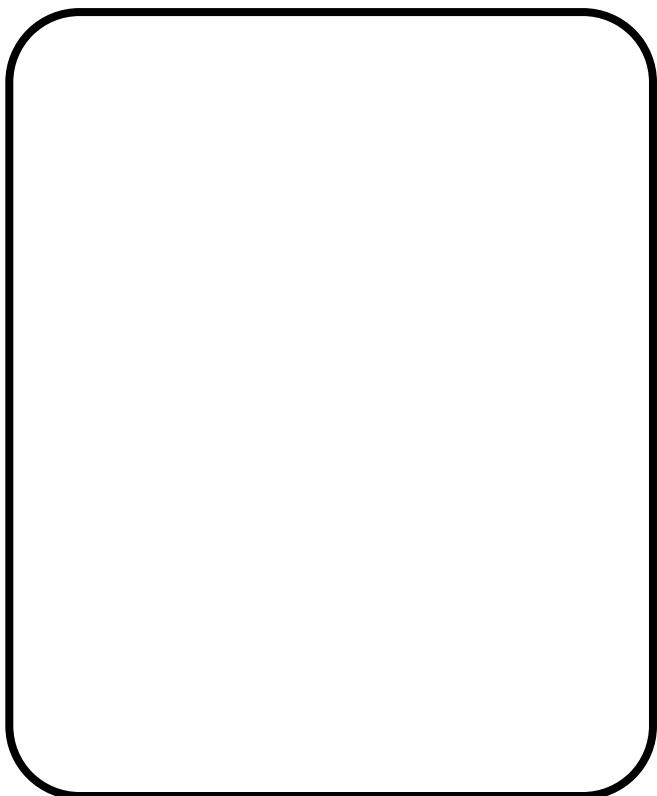
