

## Winter Camping at GSCNC

**Camping in the winter is fun, exciting and beautiful! All of our GSCNC Camps are open in the winter and offer plenty of exciting winter lodging options. Once you know how the camps change in the winter, you'll be all set to camp!**

**Washstands:** All above-ground washstands are shut off for the winter to avoid bursting water pipes. For water at units, please use the year-round frost-free water hydrants; see chart below to see which units have hydrants.

**Seasonal Water:** At many units, when the washstands are turned off, there are year-round, frost-free water hydrants that provide safe drinking and cooking water for your troop. Some units do not have year-round hydrants and water must be brought in from different units or outside camp; check out the chart to see which units do not have year-round water.

**Closed for Winter:** Some units are closed for the winter. Most Lodges at all camps stay open during the winter.

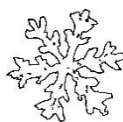
**Bathroom Changes:** At White Rock, all units stay open, because the bathrooms (and water) are open year round. Check out the chart below.

**Winter Season:** Different camps shut down for winter at different times. Take a look at the chart to see when winter changes take effect.

**Winter Weekend Day Use:** Non-lodge units that are open for winter camping are now available for Day Use reservations on Fridays and Saturdays during each camp's winter season! See chart for each camp's specific winter season.
